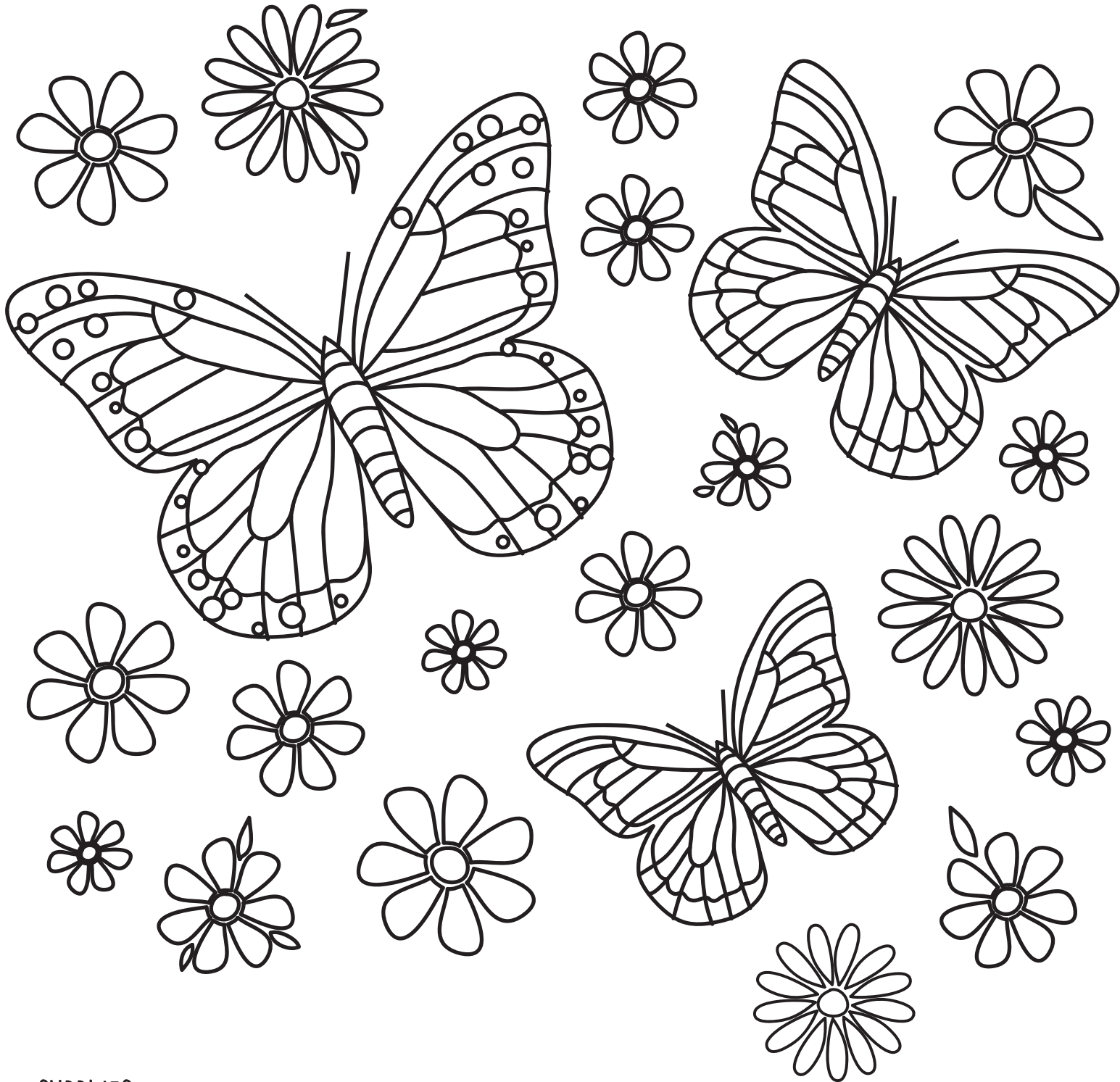


MAKING A SINGLE REPEAT PATTERN

EXAMPLE FIGURES

Fun to colorize



SUPPLIES:

Square sheet of paper (preferably a bit thicker)

Images or self-made figures

Glue

Box cutter or scissors

Ruler

Scotch tape



MAKING A SINGLE REPEAT PATTERN

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

STEP 1: Choosing the figures

Look for figures in magazines, on the internet, or create them yourself. Cut these figures neatly around the edges. Make sure you have enough to fill up your sheet.

STEP 2: Placing the figures in your square

Glue the figures onto your square sheet in a nice composition. Make sure to leave enough space at the edges, about half of your figures.

STEP 3: Cutting

Turn the sheet upside down and draw a vertical line in the middle to cut your sheet. Then exchange the position of the two parts (right to left, left to right) and connect them using the scotch tape.

STEP 4: Cutting again

Turn your square 90 degrees and repeat step 3: draw a vertical line in the middle to cut your sheet. Then exchange the position of the two parts (right to left, left to right) and connect them using the scotch tape.

STEP 5: Filling up the print

Turn your sheet back around. You will now see all figures have moved to the edges, leaving a blank space in the middle. You can fill this with the left-over figures from step 2.

STEP 6: The result

Photograph or scan the result. You can print these multiple times and stick them together. Tip: You can also digitally edit the print in Photoshop and stick them together.
